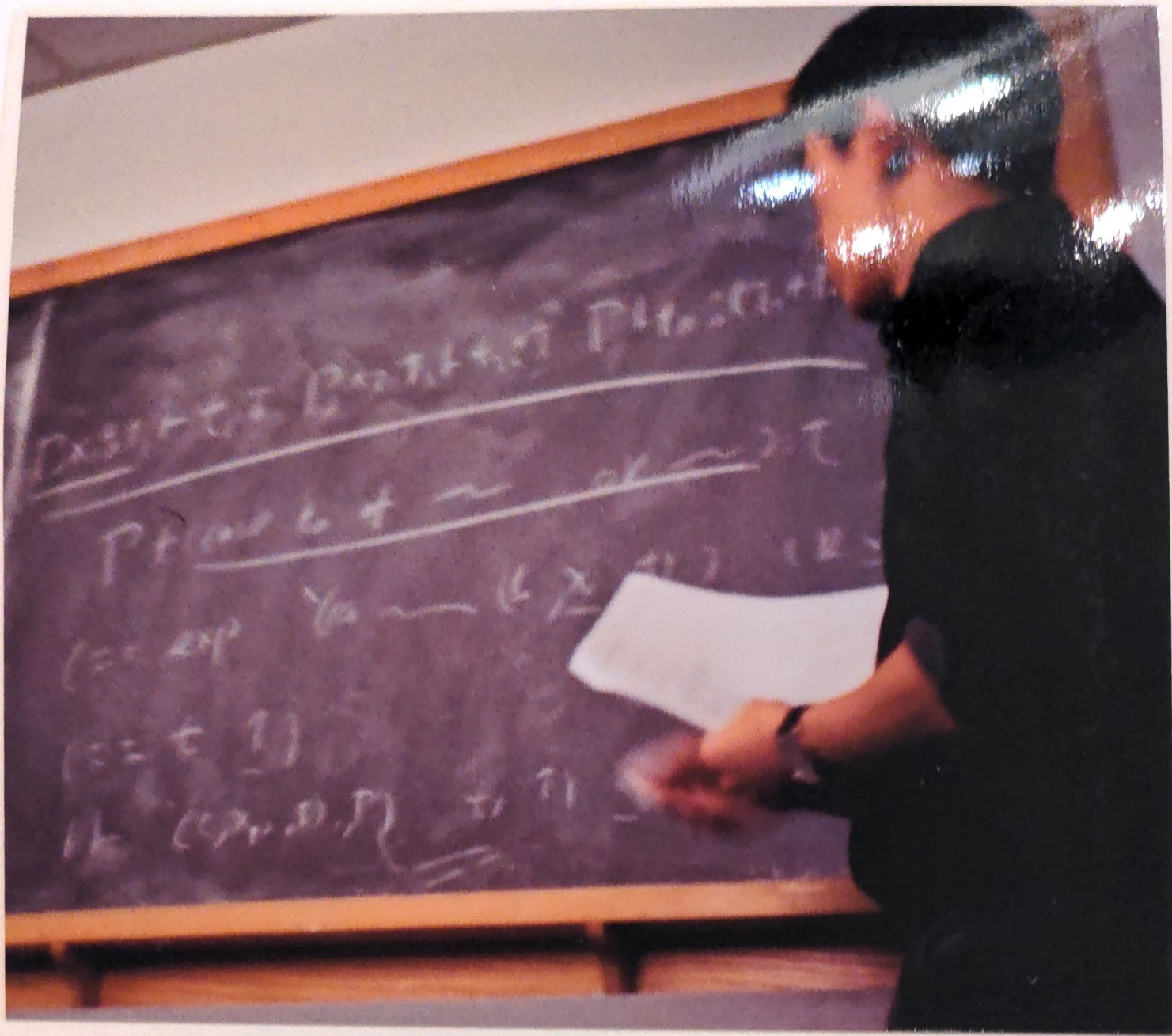

the chalkboard!



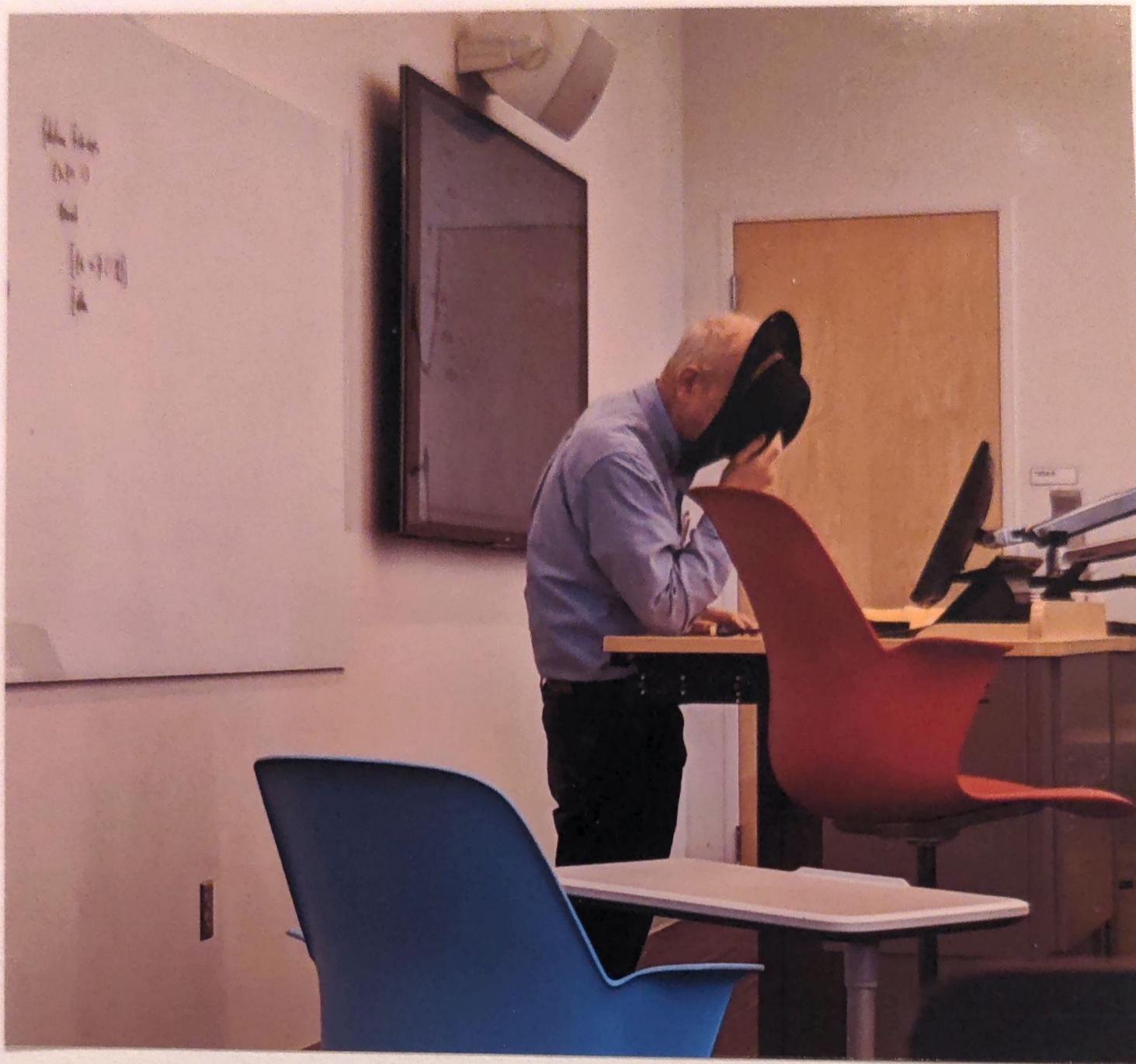
Your passion for teaching is unmatched! The projector

the shower >\_<



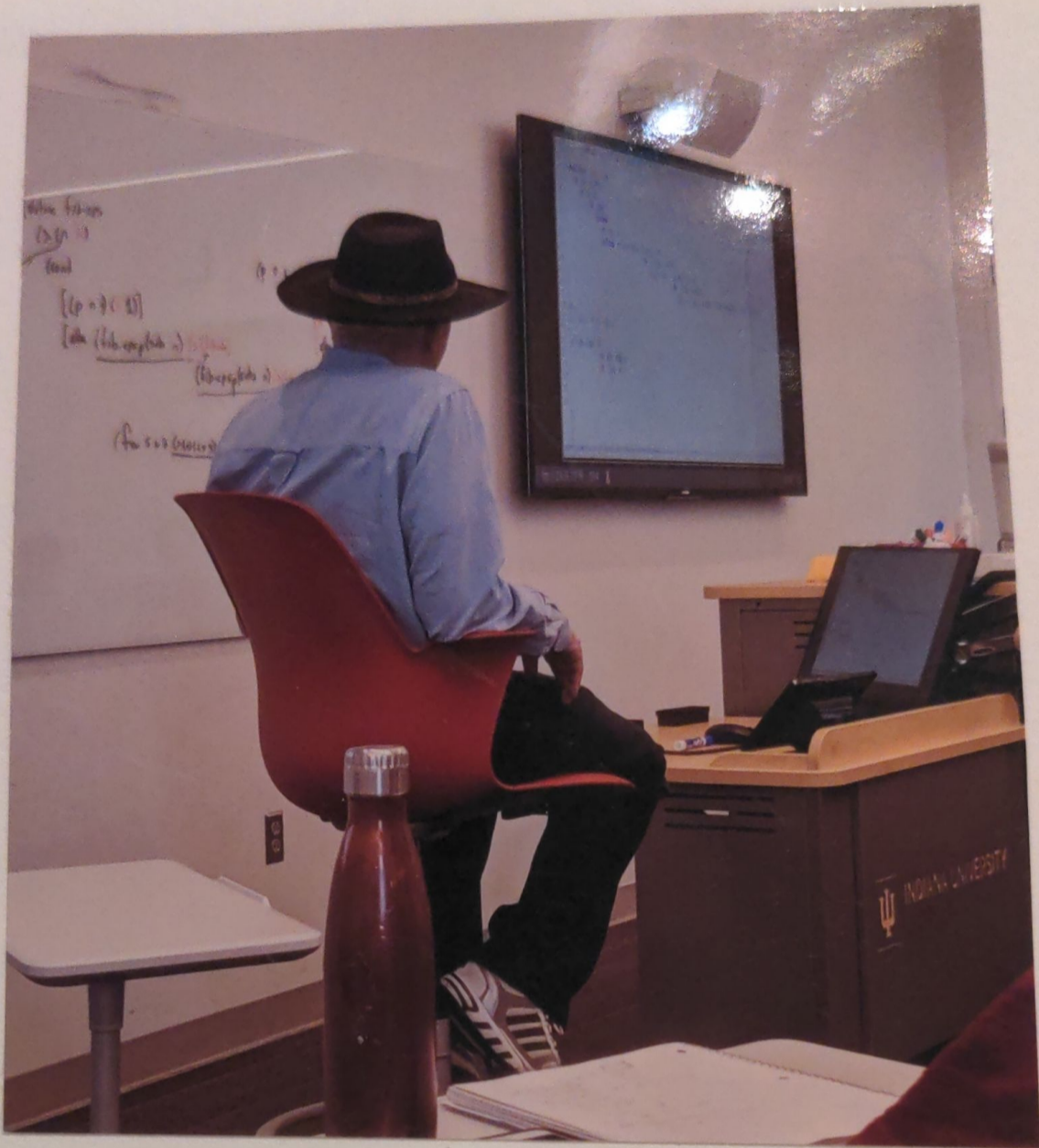
